Observe these simple courtesies to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience during your visit to Wolf Run Park:

- Pets must be on a leash at all times, except in the “bark park.” Owners must clean up after their pets.
- Campfires, alcohol and illegal drugs are prohibited.
- Motorized vehicles are restricted to designated parking areas.
- Visitors must remain on designated trails within all forested areas of the park to protect rare resources.
- Hunting is allowed only through a permit system administered through the park district. A limited number of bow season permits are issued each year to maintain healthy animal populations.
- Littering is prohibited. Pack out the trash.
- Removal of plants, animals, minerals, artifacts or other natural features is prohibited.
- Help preserve the solitude of the park by being considerate and quiet.

The Knox County Park District continues to seek ways to improve the quality of our users' visits to Wolf Run. The dog park allows users to exercise their dogs off leash in a two-acre, fenced area adjacent to the Yauger Road parking lot. Dogs on leashes are welcomed anytime at Wolf Run. New for 2012, the Sub-alpine Hiking Club Trail was constructed, a fishing pier was built and a new picnic shelter awaits your next meal.

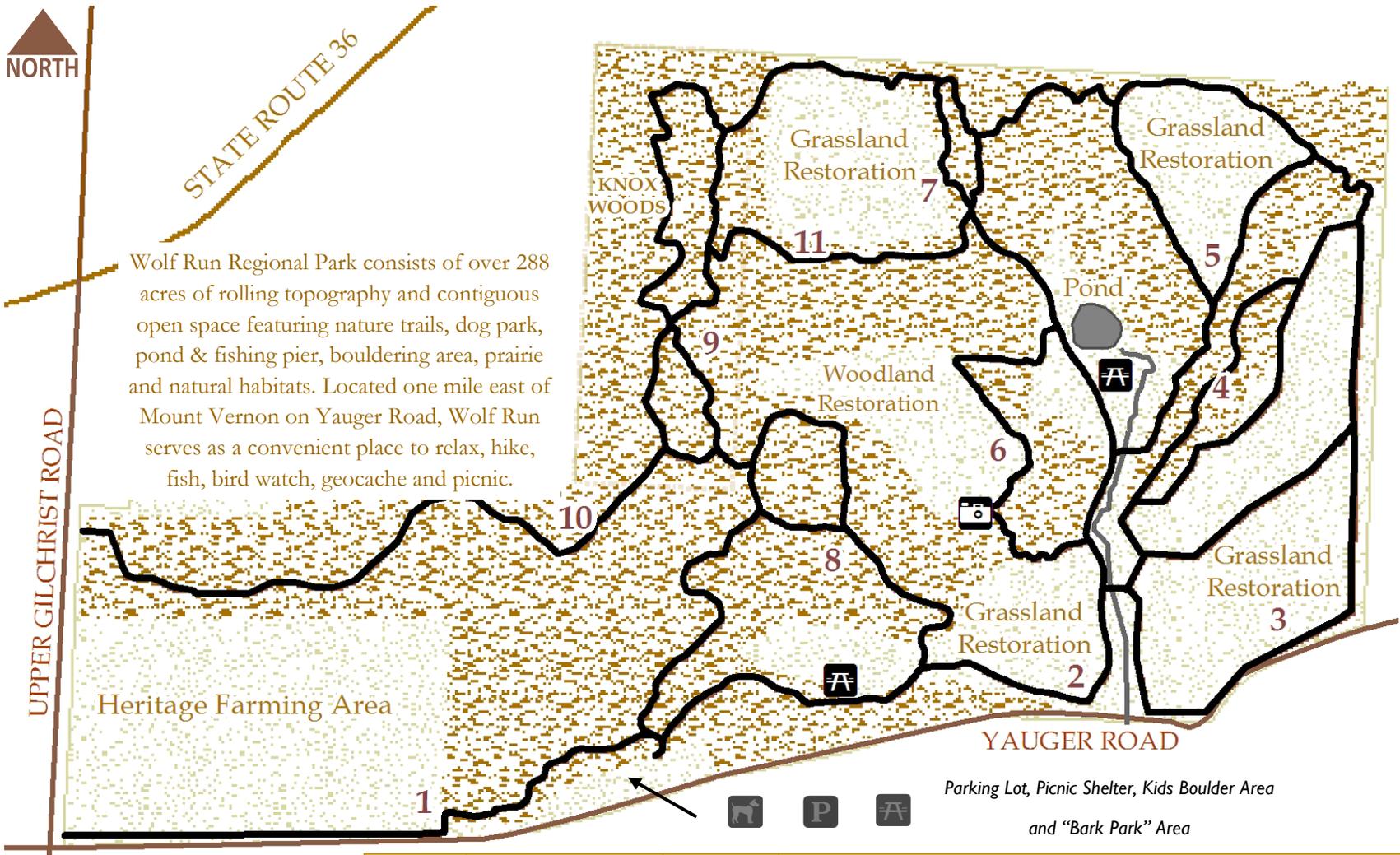


STATE ROUTE 36

1	Mary Miller	0.5	Named for a generous contributor to Wolf Run Park
2	Pond	0.7	Picnic tables and a fishing pond
3	Meadow Ridge	0.6	Enjoy prairie, links to Wolf Hollow & Little Deerfield
4	Wolf Hollow	0.4	A nearly level trail, easy to hike
5	Back 40	0.8	Crosses Wolf Run, explores northeastern area of park
6	Overlook	0.5	Observation deck with a spectacular 12-mile view
7	Little Deerfield	0.5	A favorite bedding and foraging area for deer
8	Woodland	1.0	Mixed hardwood habitat and link to Knox Woods trail
9	Knox Woods	1.0	State nature preserve with mixed hardwoods
10	Fox Glen	0.5	Connects Knox Woods with Yauger Rd. sidewalk
11	Sub-alpine Hiking Club	0.3	Named in honor of the 80th anniversary of this Knox Co. club
