History of the Park

This 70-acre site located at 7077 Thayer Road, Mount Vernon 43050, is leased from the Knox County Commissioners. Originally planned as an expansion area of the now-closed county landfill, this site abounds with wildlife such as red fox, white-tailed deer and cedar waxwings to name a few. The site also features a vernal pool.

The Ohio Horseman's Council, Knox County
Chapter (OHC, KKC) provides assistance in the
maintenance of the Thayer Ridge Park trails which
are used for horseback riding and horse related
events. In 2015-2016 the Ohio Horseman's Council
Knox County Chapter designed and completed a
perimeter loop trail for the horse-back riding
community. The loop trail traverses a bridge
completed in 2014 by the OHC, KCC which
overlooks the Heart of Ohio Trail. Recently the
Knox County Park District and OHC, KCC
constructed a larger, additional parking lot
conducive for multiple horse trailers and rigs as
well as a hitching post for horses.

In 2010, A nine-hole disc golf course was installed with assistance from the Rotary Club of Mount Vernon and Knox County and Rotary District International #6690. The 2009 Leadership Knox Class and the Lucy Knox Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution was instrumental in donating some of the park amenities.

The area to the north of the park consists of the Knox County Compost Facility and closed Knox County landfill, and the area west of the park is a private hunting preserve.

Highlights of the Park;

The park includes a spacious parking lot with an information kiosk, portable restroom, pergola shade structure with a picnic table and grill for a family picnic. Benches are also located at the site.

The 15.5 acre nine hole disc golf course is available on open grassland for those who enjoy the sport of disc/frisbee golfing. The course at Thayer Ridge is a perfect course for beginners. Discs are available for loan at the Knox County Park District office by calling 740-392-7275.

Thayer Ridge is one out of (7) parks that feature a geocache on our newly established GeoTrail. Go to our website for more information on the Trail.

A popular attraction with many of the Knox County Park District Parks is bird watching. Many photographers visit Thayer Ridge to capture images of the 95 various bird species in the park. Visit the www.ebird.org for a list of those sighted.

The trails at Thayer Ridge are accessible for horseback riding. Thayer Ridge Park serves as the first park managed by the Knox County Park District to offer bridle and mountain bike access.



The park offers archery hunting by permit only through the Knox County Park District during Ohio's white-tailed deer archery season.

Located within the park is a natural vernal pool. During the spring, vernal pools come to life with amphibians as they serve as a breeding ground. The vernal pool at Thayer Ridge Park has seen fairy shrimp, wood frogs and mole salamander spermatophore.

- Camping is not permitted.


