**Fire and Ice Wrap up** In spite of the threat of inclement weather, we enjoyed a very successful Fire and Ice event at Honey Run Waterfall on December 9, 2022. The Knox County Park District, Millwood Church of Christ, Knox Area Transit, Knox County Sheriff and over fifty volunteers (Park District

and Millwood Church) teamed again to bring to reality the popular Fire and Ice event that benefits Food For The Hungry of Knox County.

After parking at the Millwood Church of Christ and contributing either food or funds to Food for the Hungry, guests were transported to the park by Knox Area Transit where they embarked on a magical journey to the waterfall, guided by enchanting luminaria.

KAT transported 954 people on their round trip to the falls, \$1,100 was raised for Food for the Hungry as well as a pickup truck load of donated food. The total county-wide contributions were \$353,367.86 and 20.7 truckloads of food.

Visit the trail and take a selfie, use the #parkdistrictstorybook23 and share your photo.


The new book starting in April will be Raindrops to Rainbow by John Micklos Jr. and Charlene Chua.

## Disc Golf Course Revitalization at Thayer Ridge Park

Disc golf is a growing sport that has exploded in popularity over the last decade. It borrows many rules and terms from traditional golf, but players throw plastic discs to metal baskets. In Knox County, a group of local disc golf enthusiasts and volunteers are making improvements to the course at Thayer Ridge Park. This course was originally installed in 2010 with a grant from the local Rotary and Rotary International.

Recently, Rotary and Rotary International awarded another grant to further improvements to the course. The goal is to continue to provide a welcoming and fun experience for new players in the area, while enhancing the course to allow an interesting challenge for those with some playing experience. To accomplish this, the 9-hole layout will be partially redesigned to incorporate the adjacent woods, increase the width of the fairways on the open (non-wooded) holes, and

The list has approximately 20 entities listed and Park District is at the tail end of the list. Have you ever wondered where those real property tax dollars go that are paid to the Park District? Here is just a short list of some of the planned projects for 2023.

Come join the Park District at the Brown Family Environmental Center's (BFEC) Earth Day Celebration at the BFEC on Saturday, April 22 from noon until 4 p.m. The focus for the Park District will be "trails" in conjunction with Rails To Trails Conservancy "Celebrate Trails Day" on Earth Day this year. The BFEC is literally a stone's throw from the Kokosing Gap Trail, one section of the Ohio To Erie Trail/Great American Rail-Trail in Knox County. Learn about Knox County's multi-model trails, cycling safety and activities.

On Saturday, May 6, the Black Fork Gravel Grinders will hold their annual event in the Brinkhaven/Mohican area. Cyclists travel from all over the eastern part of the United States (MI, IN, KY, WV, VA, PA, NY and OH) to take part in the event. They expect over 500 cyclists to descend upon east central Ohio on this date. According to their website "this must do gravel road race and ride spans some of the most scenic, grueling and diverse gravel roads in Ohio." The Black Fork Gravel Grinders mission is "to cultivate an awareness and passion for gravel road riding, challenge riders of all abilities and backgrounds, and do this by staging an epic cycling event." There will be three route lengths offered: a 23, 30mile ride, and a 54-mile race loop. The Mohican Valley Trail, Bridge of Dreams location is scheduled to be an aid station hosted by the Central Ohio Mountain Bike Organization's Bike Patrol for the cyclists. Most cyclists utilizing the aid station will come to this location between the hours of 10:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m.

Tree removals: Park District recently hired Mohican Tree Service to remove a very large, standing, dead cottonwood at the Riley Chapel Road river access.

Park District also recently contracted with Burch Tree Service to grind the 20+ invasive callery pear stumps lining the driveway and remove several standing dead or dying black locust and box elder trees at Brinkhaven Park. Clean up also included removing downed trees from the edges of the wooded areas, as well as, tree removal from a small pine grove. Stay tuned for more improvements that are planned for Brinkhaven Park in the future!


Trail Projects: Many local trail utilizers are familiar with the failed asphalt in the Mount Liberty area on the Heart of Ohio Trail. For several years now there have been signs posted about the uneven pavement. The source of the problem appears to be tree roots. Park District has contracted with Hill's Blacktop and Concrete, Sunbury OH to repair the blacktop in this area. It will require removing and replacing the asphalt, the base will be checked and compacted if needed. The hope will be to get this project underway in April.

Park District contracted with Asphalt Systems Ohio Inc. to seal a portion of the Heart of Ohio Trail from Graham Road to Pittsburgh Avenue in Mount Vernon. ASI utilizes a bio-based product made from soybeans for their asphalt trail sealing. This is an environmentally friendly method of sealing asphalt. This project is scheduled to begin late April/early May.

For both projects, please expect trail closures during the active construction/trail sealing. Park District will post closures on our Facebook page and contractors will post on-site signage.

Park/Trail Projects: Grassbaugh's LLC recently completed a driveway/parking lot improvement project at the Honey Run Highlands parking lot on Hazel Dell Road. The project included replacing two failed culverts and placing 6" pipe and three catch basins to handle surface runoff. This project will address the severe erosional issues to the driveway. Grassbaugh's are on-line to complete an additional project at the Honey Run Waterfall parking lot directly across from the Highlands lot where a failed culvert will be replaced. Both projects were necessary and will be extremely beneficial as park patrons for the Honey Run Waterfall Park are asked to park in the Honey Run Highlands parking lot and cross the road. The Honey Run Waterfall parking lot is reserved for handicapped parking only with the 2021 installation of the concrete pad, walkway and
